A British bird charity is looking for a scientist to monitor seabirds on Gough Island in the South Atlantic Ocean. It's 2,400 km from the nearest land, South Africa, and is only 17 km long. There is no landing strip for planes, and the island is only visited by a ship once a year. The successful applicant will join a team of seven other workers — the only people on the otherwise uninhabited island — and around eight million seabirds.

For nature lovers, this may seem like paradise but this is no tropical island. Gough Island experiences year-round strong winds and heavy rainfall. The weather is only one hardship that residents must endure: no fresh food is permitted on Gough Island for fear of contaminating the pristine natural environment. All food is either frozen or tinned and is delivered by ship once a year along with the other supplies that the islanders will need for the next 12 months. While the workers are physically isolated, they have the internet and so are able to stay in contact with family and friends.
